## Counseling Services Remodel

The remodel of Counseling Services is well underway. An interior design consultant has been retained to



assist with the color and flooring selections as well as furniture placement and design. Color choices have been made and each new office space is taking shape. Expected completion is targeted for the

end of June/ beginning of July, 2008.

## CBOC Quarterly Report

The CBOC (Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee) Quarterly Report, as of April 2008, has been published and is available on the college website or by clicking on the underlined report title (above). The report contains a financial summary, as of February 29, 2008, of Measure W Bond expenditures and encumbrances, as well as detailed information on all Bond projects that are currently in progress.

## Disabled Access Improvements

A Disabled Access Committee is being established and will immediately begin to review and prioritize a report that was generated by TLCD Architecture that contains findings and recommendations relating to disability access on campus.

An initial part of this project was the installation of new shower transfer benches in the PE building in February 2008.

## Replace Instructional Equipment

Cost estimates for replacement of the equipment and flooring in the Fitness Lab and Weight Room have been received and reviewed by the Bond Implementa-

tion Planning Committee. Authorization to go to bid on the proposed project has been approved by the Board of Trustees at the April 9th meeting. The bid and award process is planned for April/May 2008. It is anticipated that the update of the Fitness Lab/Weight Room will be complete during the month of August 2008.

## Point Arena

A site visit by several members of the Bond Implementation Planning Committee, Bureau of Land Management, and Brian Wright/TLCD, took place on April 7th. It was determined that a building evaluation as well as inspection and asbestos reports would be required in order to best define the needs and requirements of the site. Coastal Commission regulations will also be considered regarding the remodel/maintenance of site. TLCD will help outline specs for materials based on defined needs and the extent to which remodeling and/or upgrading will take place.

The Point Arena Committee will be meeting during the third week of April to determine the next steps to be taken and to draft a Board Resolution to begin this project.

## Student Center/Cafeteria (renovate current library building)

The Lowery Building Committee has been formed to begin the planning process for the remodel of the Lowery Library Building. Options for use and purpose of the building will be considered as a result of the anticipated move to the new Library/Learning Resource Center.

## Library/Learning Resource Center

TLCD Architecture is currently conducting a cost estimate based on Preliminary Plans.

TLCD made presentations to both CBOC and the Board of Trustees during April detailing the progress of the project to date.
