ARTICLE I: PREAMBLE

We, the students of Mendocino-Lake Community College District, do hereby establish the Arts Club of Mendocino College as a means to represent art students of Mendocino College. The purpose of this club is to unite art students of Mendocino Community College and to organize and participate in art events at Mendocino Community College.

ARTICLE II: NAME

The name of this association shall be the Arts Club of Mendocino College hereinafter referred to as ACMC.

ARTICLE III: OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the ACMC shall be:

- a. To unite all art students of Mendocino-Lake Community College District, who are registered students of Mendocino Community College.
- b. To advocate for more student artist participation in events held by ACMC and other art-related club events.
- c. To organize student artist events for the members of the ACMC.
- d. To foster relationships with other clubs on campus related to the arts, and also to connect student artists with one other at Mendocino Community College.
- e. To encourage participation in art events and other campus events.
- f. To provide consistent amount of art events for students on campus.

ARTICLE IV: MEMBERSHIP

Any student who is registered with Mendocino Community College or is a member of the Mendocino-Lake Community College District are qualified to become members of ACMC. In addition, they will pay a membership fee as dictated by the Club, or be exempt through sweat equity as dictated by the Club.

Ex-club members may be eligible to participate in the Club up to four (4) semesters, or two (2) years counting from the time they will not be registered with the College. They will pay an additional fee to the Club as an alumnus.

ARTICLE V: EXECUTIVE OFFICERS

Order of Ranking

- a. The Executive Officers of the ACMC shall be: President, Vice President, Publicity Officer, Treasurer, and Secretary. These officers shall perform the duties prescribed by the ACMC Bylaws.
- b. Order of Ranking Executive Officers shall be: President, Vice President, Publicity Officer, Treasurer, and Secretary.

ARTICLE VI: ACMC MEETINGS

Section 1. ACMC Executive Meeting

The ACMC Executive Meeting shall be held a minimum of four (4) times per academic year.

Section 2. ACMC General Meeting

The ACMC General Meeting shall be held a minimum of one (1) time per semester.

Section 3. ACMC Special Meeting

The ACMC Special Meeting may be called by the President, or may be called by a written request of the majority of the ACMC Members and/or Executive Officers.

ARTICLE VII: PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

The rules contained in the current edition of Brown Act shall govern the ACMC in all cases to which they are applicable, and consistent with the ACMC Constitution. This should be true unless otherwise indicated by the District and/or the Associated Students of Mendocino College.

ARTICLE VIII: AMENDMENT TO ACMC CONSTITUTION

Amendment to the ACMC Constitution can be made by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the ACMC Members in attendance.
