### Important Elements:

- Author
- Title of article
- Title of magazine or source
- Date of publication
- Volume number (if required)
- Pagination (if given)
- Vendor/supplier of database
- Database name
- Name of subscribing institution
- Date of access
- URL for database access

**Note:** Spacing is important. MLA requires double spacing between entries as well as within entries.
