Thank you, again, for this wonderful opportunity!

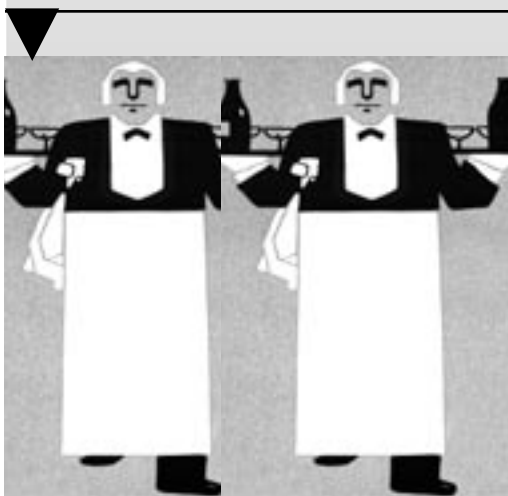

Our Investment Portfolio Grows ▼

The Foundation has increased its investment portfolio by \$2.5 million dollars with the sales of three pieces of property in Southern California that constituted the bulk of the Szanik gift. The Foundation's investment portfolio is the engine that produces a stream of income annually that the College uses for the benefit of its students. These benefits often fall into the following areas: scholarships, enhancement of programs, instructor support and capital improvements. This infusion of capital comes at an especially critical time as community colleges bear the brunt of budget reductions among the state's institutions of higher learning. The strain is further exacerbated by the increasing demands asked of the colleges as the gateway of opportunity for literally thousands of students each year.

Mendocino College is a wonderful example of what education can do to improve the life of its students and the community as a whole. The College's continued success is dependent on equal parts of an unwavering commitment to its mission, hard work and money. We have no shortage of the first two ingredients. From the College President

The Foundation continues to be the College's greatest financial supporter, increasing its funding for scholarships and programs again this year, and seeking a new Director of Development to insure continued growth and support for the future. The Foundation's support is critical as state funding, over the last couple of years, has been increasingly directed to college districts with political clout (votes) over those with critical needs, such as smaller rural colleges. So far this year, we have decided not to fill a number of key vacant job positions in order to save \$400,000. Our technology infrastructure desperately needs a \$300,000 upgrade and our main computer information system must be replaced in the next five years and may cost multi-millions. Without the Foundation's support, we would have even more serious challenges.

Fortunately, we are moving forward on several fronts. We are working with a community advisory group to gather information in spring 2006 from the communities we serve to develop a detailed plan for the future. Our RN Nursing program saw its first class graduate and student interest in the program continues to grow. Our Culinary Arts Management program plans to begin renovation of a permanent facility on the Ukiah Campus, thanks to the financial support of the Foundation and others. Our new Science Building is wonderful and both students and faculty appreciate the new resources it offers. Spring 2006 classes are just around the corner and we are offering many new classes to meet the changing needs of our students. All of us here wish you a safe and enjoyable holiday! FINANCIAL REPORT

A summary of the Finance Committee's last financial data of the Mendocino College Foundation, Incorporated, as of June 30, 2005 (unaudited) is below. The budget for fiscal year 2005-06 projects income of \$168,000. Projected expenditures are:

Salaries and operating expenses	\$	61,000
Scholarships	\$	62,000
Other grants and program support	\$	40,000
TOTAL DISBURSEMENT	\$	163,000

Of particular note is that the Foundation received the bulk of the George Szanik Estate in the amount of \$2,550,000 in the first quarter of this year. This brings the total received from this bequest to nearly \$3,000,000.
