

### IN MEMORIAL - DOUG BROWE



It is with deep sadness that we inform you that our longtime ceramics faculty member, Doug Browe, passed away early on April 5th. Doug had been battling cancer for the past two years and passed away peacefully at home with his family by his side.

Doug was an integral part of our faculty and the community, and his passion for ceramics was evident in his work and his dedication to teaching. He was known for his dedication to the craft, his kindness, and his ability to inspire students to push the boundaries of their creativity.

Well known for his pottery work at the Hoyman Browe Studio in Ukiah, Doug had been affiliated with Mendocino College since he taught ceramics part-time in the 1990's. He most recently worked as the ceramics studio manager for three years, until he was hired as a full-time assistant professor of art (ceramics and sculpture) in 2007.

Doug's passing is a great loss for our community, and our thoughts and prayers are with his family and loved ones during this difficult time. We will always remember Doug as a gifted artist and an exceptional teacher who made a profound impact on the lives of his students and colleagues.

As we mourn his loss, let us also celebrate his life and the countless contributions he made to our school and to the field of ceramics. We will share more information about a memorial service if it becomes available.

### IN MEMORIAL - DALENE NICKELSON



Dalene Nickelson passed away on Tuesday, March 14th, 2023, surrounded by family and loved ones in her Ukiah home.

In 1994, Dalene first joined the staff at Mendocino College as a student worker in the library, while she worked toward her own associate degrees in Liberal Arts and Computer Science. She worked in the Admissions and Records Department and Maintenance and Operations where she supported daily operations, events, and major construction projects. Dalene put her creative hand wherever the Mendocino Community College at large could benefit, including the raising of over \$40k in student scholarships, protecting local wildlife, and having dozens of feral cats spayed/neutered and adopted out. She was also an eager supporter of the college's annual ceramics and plant sales.

After 22 years with the college, Dalene retired to devote her time to her hobbies and grandchildren, and boy did she. She was, in short, the Grandma of Grandmas.
