The Mendocino College Registered Nursing Program provides the education and training needed to prepare students to sit for the California Registered Nursing Licensure Exam (NCLEX-RN).

The program is four full-time semesters of courses completed <u>after fulfillment</u> of prerequisite and general education requirements.

Applications are available each February and are due by the posted deadline in March for Fall Admissions.

OTHER INFORMATION/ REQUIREMENTS

- Post-acceptance physical exam, lab tests & immunizations are required.
- Science prerequisite courses must be at least 4 semester units each, with a lab.
- Interested individuals should meet with an academic counselor early for advisement on prerequisites and General Education Courses.
- Transportation to clinical sites is the responsibility of the student. Clinical hours may include day, evenings, or weekend hours.
- Applicants who meet the minimum grade requirements are eligible for the lottery for admission. Grade requirements are based on overall college GPA, English GPA, as well as Anatomy, Phsiology, and Microbiology GPA.
- Successful TEAS Exam passing score of at least 62% is required.
- ✓ 20 students are accepted each Fall.
- Attendance at an on-site preapplication workshop is required.
