

ASMC hosted its first Student Leadership Conference on Wednesday March 20 to promote student involvement opportunities. It highlighted the three main entry points for students to gain leadership experience: Student Senate, Student Clubs, and Participatory Governance on campus committees. Former Advisor Phil Warf was honored for 13 years of service to the ASMC.

#### HYDRATION STATIONS

ASMC recently amended a previously approved budget, now totalling \$52,000, to update the hydration stations in every building on the Ukiah Campus. The student senate also approved the installation of a second station in the Library. ASMC purchased the previous hydration stations and remains committed to the best possible availability of this basic student need. Facilities will soon assess hydration station needs on satellite campuses.

#### ADVOCACY UPDATE

ASMC President Lisa Baker went to Sacramento on March 7th to advocate for students on issues that are common to community college students in California. She spent the morning meeting with Assemblyman James Gallagher and Senator Brian Dahle as an affiliate of Student Senate for California Community Colleges. They discussed CalGrant Reform protection, affordable student housing, and EBT access on campuses, among other issues. Several hundred students marched to the capital to bring awareness to student needs and to put pressure on lawmakers to act in the interest of their future workforce constituency.

The conference was held at West Hills Community College Lemoore campus with the theme of "I have Potential". The conference is a three-day event. The conference started on Friday, March 8th with a wonderful group leadership activity, dinner, and speakers. Topics for the evening included Sense of Belonging and Cultural Pride with CSU San Marcos CAMP Director Maria Escobedo Venegas and Dr. Manuel Santillana.

The second day was packed. The day started with a Networking session. Students created their digital business card that they got to share with other CAMP students. It is part of the Professional Day

The month of March was busy for CAMP scholars. We had some great speakers in the CAMP CCS class. Early in the month, CAMP CCS students learned a lot about small business entrepreneurship with the visit of Adrian from Mitote Café. Mitote Café is a hot pink coffee house on wheels with a Mexican twist. The menu includes a gansito frappe, horchata latte, and every month an opportunity for IG and Facebook followers to pick a new flavor such as Mazapan Frappe. Adrian is a local entrepreneur that just opened his small business. Because it is a coffee house on wheels, he can post in different locations and some of those include Ukiah High School and Mendocino College.

#### ANNUAL STUDENT ART SHOW







Work must be original-no plagiarism will be allowed.


Original artwork will be judged based on demonstration of effort, time spent and attention to both form and content (i.e. material manipulation/craftsmanship and concept/meaning such as the connection to sustainability), submission should include a short statement describing the artwork and your intention (maximum length 500 words), artwork should have been created within the last three years. All mediums accepted.

When and Where? Please deliver your artwork to the Library by noon on 4/22. Please pick up your art work in the library the week of 4/29. Posters should be set up in the Student Center (Lowery Building) by noon on 4/22 or dropped off at the Library prior to this date. Please pick up your poster by 4/25 after 3:30 pm, or in the library the next week. Please label your poster or art work with your name and MC email. Voting will occur in the Lowery Center from 4/22-4/25 (please vote for your favorite!), with winners announced the next week.

Museum explores the 40+ year history of the School, while showcasing numerous examples of fine furniture and crafted wood arts.


