NARCAN DISTRIBUTION EVENTS

At the beginning of March, the college held a Narcan distribution event in the Lowery Student Center. Over 45 student contacts were made which included a brief training about what to look for in a person who may be experiencing an overdose, how to administer the medication, and what to do afterwards. A hybrid training was conducted for staff and students as part of the kick off activities. Twenty-two people were trained and Narcan was distributed to the attendees. Since the kick off, Mendocino County Substance Use Disorder Treatment Prevention Team was on site to distribute Narcan (in April), and HMA travelled to all of our Centers to provide distribution events (also in April). HMA will be on site for the Health & Wellness Fair in May as will Mendocino County Aids and Viral Hepatitis Network (MCAVHN). Counselor/Coordinator Lisa Larimer Burtis has been working with Health Management Associates/COPE Program to craft our distribution strategy.

HEALTH & WELLNESS WORKSHOPS

The Health and Wellness Spring Workshop Series, which was accomplished in an intentional collaboration between multiple departments. The workshops this semester have been focused on the following topics: financial literacy, "Creating Study Spaces," "Difficult Conversations," and "Busy Lives". These trainings were available both in person in Ukiah and online via zoom. In addition to our student offerings this semester was the student-driven Sharing Circle. This effort was a collaboration with Joan McDowell, seasoned facilitator, and Asst. Professor Dean Watson-Krasts.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Several counselors attended the Career Compass Summit in Sacramento the week of May 1st. This conference is known for providing the latest trends in career growth, supporting counselors to better understand the opportunities that await new graduates and improve our ability to inform our students about the everchanging world and needs of our employers.

GRADUATION & TRANSFER FAIR

Our Transfer Center is planning to host a Graduation Transfer Fair with the support of our Admissions & Records department. Students will be invited to pick up their grad swag and have last minute check-in appointments to ensure they are on-track to graduate and transfer to a four-year institution. Multiple dates have been chosen in the beginning of May to ensure students have options to participate.

ENERGY MASTER PLANNING & INFRASTRUCTURE RENEWAL RESILIENCY PROGRAM

Following the January 2024 Facilities & Sustainability report to the Board of Trustees, over two dozen engineering firms were invited to participate in the District-wide Energy Master Planning and Infrastructure Renewal Requests for Proposals (RFP) process. The District received (3) qualified responses and after a thorough review by staff, Climatec LLC was selected.

Key objectives of this program:

- Develop an energy master plan
- Modernize aging infrastructure and systems throughout our sites including but not limited to: HVAC, building automation, interior & exterior lighting, building envelope, electrical switchgear and systems, etc.
- Implement additional, reliable on-site power generation & microgrid technologies
- Retro-commission the existing solar PV system
- Minimize financial risks through fixed project costs

Next Steps:

At a future Board meeting, the Board will be provided with a proposed master agreement for approval that defines all aspects of the agreement with Climatec.

CALFRESH OUTREACH

CalFresh staff have been promoting healthy living on our campus by throwing our first event which included sand volleyball and CalFresh application assistance! Our CalFresh team tabled with our canopy at the sand volleyball court and had laptops available for students to apply for CalFresh.
