




REQUIRED STUDENT TRAINING

OUR COMMITTMENT TO YOUR SAFETY & RESOURCES

Dear Students,

At Mendocino College, we are deeply committed to supporting and protecting all of our students, regardless of immigration status. We understand that concerns about immigration enforcement actions can impact your sense of well-being and ability to learn. We want to assure you that we are here to support you and provide a safe and inclusive environment.

Our Commitment: Mendocino College is dedicated to creating a supportive environment for all members of our diverse student body. We have established guidelines to address any concerns related to immigration enforcement actions on our campuses. These guidelines are designed to protect your rights and ensure your safety.

What to Do if ICE Seeks Access to Campus:

- If a federal immigration enforcement official, such as an ICE agent, requests access to a campus or student information, MLCCD personnel will refer the request to the Office of the Superintendent/President. The office will work with legal services to determine the lawfulness of the request.
- If you observe ICE officials on campus, immediately report their presence to campus security at 707-468-3071.

Know Your Rights: It is important to be aware of your rights in interactions with immigration officials:

- You do not have to open the door if an immigration agent is knocking. If they have a judicial warrant, they will not need your permission.
- You have the right to remain silent & not answer any questions from an immigration agent.
- Do not sign anything without first speaking to a lawyer.
- If you are outside your home, ask the agent if you are free to leave. If they say yes, leave calmly.

Resources Available:

- The California Attorney General's Office provides guidance and resources for various sectors, including higher education.
- The Immigrant Legal Resource Center offers free Red Cards with reminders for asserting your rights and protecting yourself in various situations. Red Cards are available in multiple languages and can be downloaded and printed.
- We have Red Cards available for students and their families, which can be obtained in any of our student services offices.
- The Dream Center assists undocumented/ AB540 students & students from mixed-status families and will continue to provide services, resources, and support. If you need assistance or just someone to talk to, please reach out by email at dreamcenter@mendocino.edu, phone at 707-467-1026, or visit us in the Lowery Student Center. General Services are available Monday through Friday from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm, and Counseling Services are available on Mondays from 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm.

We are here to support you and ensure that you have access to the resources and information you need. If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to reach out to us.

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS WITH RED CARDS

At Mendocino College, we support all students, regardless of immigration status.

Our mission is to create a safe, inclusive, and supportive environment for everyone.

What Are Red Cards?

Red Cards remind you of your rights in interactions with immigration officers. They are available in multiple languages and help you remember how to protect yourself.

How to Use Red Cards:

- Do Not Open the Door: You do not have to open the door for immigration agents.
- Remain Silent: You have the right to remain silent.
- Do Not Sign Anything: Speak to a lawyer before signing any documents.
- Ask If You Are Free to Leave: If outside, ask if you can leave. If yes, leave calmly.





The three artists featured in Mendocino College Gallery's latest exhibition create works that consider the implications of our human imprint on nature.

Art that creates a deeper awareness of the environmental impact of our actions and inspires a shift toward more sustainable living is Heather Law's passion.

ASMC BUSINESS


We raise money for student activities and scholarships;
