1. SPN 551 - Elementary Spanish for Older Adults: Level II

a. First reading for SPN 551. Velazquez-Zvierkova informed the committee that this is a second course for older adults learning elementary Spanish. Velazquez-Zvierkova added that the first course was well received, and students are requesting an additional level. Osea asked about the way the methods of evaluation were listed on the COR and suggested listing them like the credit course. Whetzel questioned five SLOs and suggested reducing them to three. Velazquez-Zvierkova explained that there are four SLOs for language acquisition and one for cultural components.

D. DAM (Fuller, Pai)

1. DAM 110 – Digital Image Manipulation in Adobe Photoshop

a. M/S (Terrill/Zuber) to approve DAM 110. Terrill questioned the use of "fostering effective collaboration in team-based environments" in SLO #5 and how that would be measurable and felt there was a disconnect with the rest of the SLO. Zuber questioned if objective #1 and SLO #1 were too similar. The committee also discussed the wordiness of the objectives and SLOs overall and suggested removing the extra words in parentheses or revising the objectives and SLOs if the information is needed. M/S/C (Terrill/Zuber) to table DAM 110.

V. DISCUSSION

A. Common Course Numbering

Aguirre informed the committee that bands of course numbers for courses that will not be part of CCN have been released and asked the committee their opinion on when to switch to using these numbers. Polak suggested not making any changes until we get more guidance since we do not know if there will be more courses after Phase III. Terrill agreed and referred to the back and forth with AB 705 and AB 1705. Whetzel added that there needs to be thoughtful discussions on how to proceed as it will be a big process that will include several different departments on campus. Aguirre added that there are some Title 5 changes coming soon for CORs.
