CALIFORNIA INDIAN HERITAGE CELEBRATION


On September 25, 2025, Mendocino College hosted the **California Indian Heritage Celebration**, bringing together several hundred community members to honor and

EAGLES RISE

The Eagles Rise program supports juvenile justiceimpacted students both inside juvenile hall and on campus at Mendocino College. Our goal is to identify and connect with these students while providing resources that address their unique needs.

- Offering targeted support, such as record expungement clinics in collaboration with the Clean Slate Project of Mendocino County.
- Developing a dedicated, welcoming campus space where justice-impacted students can gather, build relationships, and access support.
- Establishing the **Rising Scholars Club**, a student-led group designed to amplify the voices of justice-impacted students, foster peer support, and normalize identification as justice-impacted within the college community.
- Preparing to offer CCS100 course inside the Mendocino County Juvenile Hall.

We will host a free record expungement clinic in partnership with the Clean Slate Project on Thursday, November 6, from 9:30 AM to 3:30 PM at the Eagles Nest on the Ukiah Campus.

This event gives community members the chance to start clearing eligible criminal records—an important step toward improving access to jobs, housing, and education.

FEDERAL UPDATE


Over the past month, there have been two significant items from the federal government that affect Mendocino College.

On September 10, 2025, I received notice from the Federal Department of Education that they are discontinuing funding for all Hispanic-Serving Institutions (Title V Part A) grants. It is unprecedented that funding is discontinued for continuing grants like ours. We were awarded a 5-year grant, with this year being year 3. The focus of our grant is the retention of all students with a dedicated team of four full-time employees.

Given the uncertainty at the federal level of higher education funding, last year, through our participatory governance structure, there was an agreement to fund the HSI program until June 2026, regardless of federal funding, utilizing one-time funds. This forethought will allow the college to plan our next steps over the next few months.

On September 16, 2025, I received notification that our grant application to the Federal Economic Development Agency within the Department of Commerce was awarded. We have been working on this grant proposal since 2023. The award is for \$4.2M towards the construction of the Willits Phase II building. Special thanks to Mac Lojowsky for his support providing documentation needed for the grant proposal; Congressman Huffman and his team for supporting this application; and the EDA Seattle Office for their persistent backing of the proposal from draft to award.

COUNSELING DEPARTMENT

The Counseling Department remains committed to supporting students from their first weeks on campus through long-term educational planning. By aligning services with institutional priorities, maintaining up-to-date knowledge on transfer pathways, and strengthening collaborations across departments, Counseling continues to advance student success and persistence. The following are some of the activities the faculty and staff have been engaged in to support students:

Student Support at the Start of the Semester

- **Provided direct support** to students during the first two weeks of the semester, focusing on urgent needs to help students begin successfully.
- Ensured timely referrals to campus and community resources addressing academic, personal, and financial barriers.

Early Alert Coordination

- Partnered with Retention Specialists to coordinate early alerts and interventions.
- Strengthened proactive approaches to identify and support students experiencing challenges early in the term.

Transfer Readiness & Professional Development

- Counselors participated in both CSU and UC professional development opportunities.
- Ensured staff have the latest updates to guide students exploring university transfer pathways.

Career Ladders Project & Department Goal Setting

- Continued **professional development and goalsetting** work through the Career Ladders Project.
- **Developed annual goals** within the CalWORKs program and the General Counseling Department.
- Goals are aligned with college-wide educational priorities and Vision 2030.

AUTOMOTIVE TECH PROGRAM CELEBRATES GRAND RE-OPENING

Mendocino College recently celebrated the grand reopening of its Automotive Technology Program after a \$3 million remodel that positions the program at the forefront of industry trends.

The upgraded facility now features expanded shop space, advanced equipment for electric and hybrid vehicles, and a new **Electric Vehicle Certificate program**. Students can also pursue associate degrees and stackable certificates in areas like chassis, smog, and engine diagnostics.

The ribbon-cutting event on October 3 included remarks from faculty and industry partners, along with tours of the renovated space. "This remodel is a leap into the future," said lead automotive faculty Michael Pratt, emphasizing the program's commitment to preparing students for careers in EV and hybrid technology.

With these enhancements, Mendocino College is now one of the few institutions in the region offering hands-on EV training—an essential step as California moves toward clean transportation.

Go Purple Day - October 16


Wear purple on Thursday, October 16, to honor survivors and raise awareness about domestic violence. Show your support and help spark conversations that promote safety, healing, and prevention.
