Dewey added that fire chiefs are requesting these courses. The curriculum is based on the California State

Fire Training approved course plan. Thomas asked about some verbiage in the catalog description. Dewey replied that he referred to the catalog description from SRJC to be in sync with other schools offering the same curriculum in the area. Whetzel suggested removing the items listed under equipment since this area is reserved for items the students will need to provide, not the school. Whetzel inquired about the objectives and SLOs. Dewey explained that the objectives and SLOs are set by the state curriculum and cannot change it. Whetzel also suggested removing the assignments listed under the methods of instruction. Osea asked about the hours of the course and suggested increasing the hours to 51 so the course is one unit versus half a unit. Dewey added that the hours are predicted by the state and cannot be changed.
