LVN-TO-RN PROGRAM

Become a Registered Nurse!

LVN-TO-RN PROGRAM

The Mendocino College LVN-to-RN Program is designed for LVNs currently licensed in California to obtain the education and training needed to sit for the California Registered Nursing Licensure Exam (NCLEX-RN).

The program is two full-time semesters of RN courses as well as one short-term transition course after completion of prerequisites and general education requirements.

Applications are available each September for Spring admission.

PLEASE NOTE

If you are an LVN that challenged the LVN boards from military service, you are eligible for admission with Advanced Standing to our second semester. The program is three semesters of full-time coursework. Contact the Nursing Education Office for an Advanced Standing application.

PROGRAM EXPENSES

- Tuition
- Textbooks
- Nursing uniforms (including watch, stethoscope, bandage, scissors, and uniform patch)
- Transportation to/from clinical sites
- Lodging for out-of-town clinical sites (if needed)
- Graduation costs

PREREQUISITES FOR ADMISSION TO THE NURSING PROGRAM

Completion of the following with a "C" or better:

- BIO 230 - Anatomy *
 - BIO 231 - Physiology *
 - BIO 259 - Microbiology *
- *Sciences must meet recency requirement. Grades of A or B are valid for 10 years, grade C is valid for 5 years.
- ENGL C1000 - English Composition
 - COMM C1000 or COMM 210 - Speech
 - PSYC C1000, PSYC 210, or CDV 200 - Psychology
 - SOC 200, 201, ANT 201, or ETH 202 - Sociology
 - HLH 214 or HLH 215 - Nutrition
 - One year recent LVN Med-Surg experience
 - Completion of RN Program Prerequisites, General Education, and Institutional Requirements before applying
 - High School Diploma or Equivalent
 - Clear Background Check and Drug Screening
 - US Citizenship or Permanent Residency with valid SSN or ITIN
 - Interested individuals should see an Academic Counselor for advisement on prerequisites and General Education course sequencing

OTHER INFORMATION/ REQUIREMENTS

- Post-acceptance physical exam, lab tests, & immunizations are required.
- Science prerequisite courses must be at least 4 semester units each, with a lab.
- Transportation to clinical sites is the responsibility of the student. Clinical hours may include day, evenings, or weekend hours.
- Program consists of lecture/lab days and one clinical day per week. Transition semester is one day per week on campus.
- Applicants who meet the minimum grade requirements are eligible for the lottery for admission. Grade requirements are based on overall college GPA, English GPA, as well as Anatomy, Physiology, and Microbiology GPA.
- Successful TEAS VII Exam passing score of at least 62% is required.
- 4 students are accepted each Spring.
- Attendance at an on-site pre-application workshop is required.
