#### V. DISCUSSION

##### A. UDL Training

Aguirre informed the committee that January 30 from 3-5 p.m. was the date offered by ASCCC to provide training for the new Title 5 requirements related to the course outline of record. Polak suggested recording the training so those that cannot attend can view it at a later date.

Whetzel asked if the committee members would be training other faculty. Aguirre confirmed that that was the idea and the committee could create training materials for other faculty. Whetzel suggested training at a future in-service would be beneficial to train more faculty. Polak added that it would be good for committee members to be leaders in developing a process on how to move forward with implementation and added that the training would be open to all faculty.

**B. Coursedog Update**

Polak informed the committee that implementation of our new curriculum management system, Coursedog, is moving forward. All curriculum proposals must be completed in eLumen by our last curriculum meeting on May 8, 2026. Anything that remains will not move over to Coursedog. Polak added that we are aiming to have Coursedog up and running by October 2026 with migration of data happening over the summer. The Curriculum Committee will receive training at the beginning of Fall 2026 semester. A few highlights about Coursedog include more flexibility and customization, integration with Colleague, and an electronic catalog.
