New Classes!

Reading and Writing for Multilingual Students
ESL 13 (Credit) and ESL 513 (Noncredit)

What are ESL 13/513?

These classes focus on the development of academic reading and writing skills for multilingual students. Students will focus on common challenges and relevant topics for multilingual writers including language learning and the brain, immigration and society, and grammar for writing. Students can take this class for credit (ESL 13) or as a noncredit class (ESL 513). Both classes prepare students for English 85.

Who should consider taking ESL 13 or 513?

- Multilingual students who have lived in the U.S. for less than five years
- Multilingual students who may not have completed four years of high school
- Multilingual students who have not taken an English class in a few years

What is a hybrid class?

This class will be taught using Canvas, our online course management system. This class will meet in the Language Lab in Ukiah some, and the rest of the class content will be taught online using Canvas.

English as a Second Language at Mendocino College

The English as a Second Language (ESL)
Program at Mendocino College offers ESL
classes from beginning to advanced levels.
Through English language instruction, we aim
to prepare students to be successful in their
lives and in our local community. We accept
new students who have never studied English
before, and students who come to us simply to
brush up on their writing skills.

Classes are offered on the Ukiah campus and also at off-site locations in Ukiah at the Ukiah Adult School and Grace Hudson Elementary School. In addition to classes in the Ukiah area, we offer classes in Anderson Valley, Covelo, Fort Bragg, Kelseyville, Lakeport, and Willits. Classes are offered Monday-Friday, with daytime and evening offerings. The ESL program offers classes for college credit and offers the 500 level courses, which are noncredit classes.

ESL Noncredit Classes

ESL program noncredit classes cost only \$12.00 a semester for all students. Noncredit classes are open enrollment classes, and students can enroll in noncredit classes after the regular semester deadlines. Students are not required to take a placement test to enroll in noncredit ESL classes. Students can repeat noncredit classes as many times as they want. All noncredit ESL classes can be applied towards the ESL Certificate of Completion.

ESL Certificate of Completion

Upon completion of the noncredit ESL program, students are eligible to receive a Certificate of Completion from Mendocino College. In order to receive the certificate, students should successfully complete at least two semesters of ESL511.
