HUMAN SERVICES PARAPROFESSIONAL: ASSOCIATE OF SCIENCE DEGREE

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The Human Services Paraprofessional Associate of Science degree

provides students with an understanding of the knowledge and skills related to Social Work, Counseling and related occupations, and helps prepare students to transfer to four-year colleges or universities to continue their education toward an advanced degree and potential licensure in Social Work or related fields.

Social Workers are counselors, educators and advocates, and work with children, adults and elders in social and welfare institutions by addressing poverty, abuse, and drug and alcohol dependence issues. In a broad sense, the Social Worker's role is to engage the individual, community and society to address issues of social injustice.



The California Employment Development Department (EDD) projects that approximately 1100 jobs will become available for Social and Human Service Assistants in our region between 2006-2016. The EDD projects a 17.2% growth in employment for the North Coast Region during this time, with 80 jobs becoming available as a result of 50 new positions and 30 replacements. In Sonoma County the projection is a 16.1% increase in jobs, with 90 openings (50 new and 40 replacements). Napa County is expecting a 50% increase in jobs, with 40 positions (30 new and 10 replacements) and the East Bay Region is expected to grow by 20.1%, with 890 vacancies (590 new and 300 replacements).

The BLS Occupational Outlook Handbook concludes the job outlook section for Social and Human Service Assistants by stating that "qualified applicants should have little difficulty finding employment".

According to Mendocino College's survey of local employers, hourly wages range from \$10.00 to \$32.00, with a mean hourly pay of \$14.83 and a median pay of \$14.00.

The pay for Social Workers is considerably higher, as can be expected. The hourly mean hourly pay state-wide is \$24.70. Regionally the median hourly pay ranges from \$18.77 (North Coast Region) to \$26.09 (East Bay Area).

Students completing the Associate Degree may be hired as Social Worker Assistants, Residential Counselors, Case Managers, or in similar paraprofessional human services positions. Students completing baccalaureate degrees can find employment in more advanced Social Work, Counseling or related occupations, and those completing graduate degrees will be qualified to pursue licensure as a Clinical Social Worker or Marriage and Family Therapist.

Goals

Mendocino College's Human Services Paraprofessional Associate of Science (HUS-AS) Degree will provide students the education necessary to work as paraprofessionals in a variety of human service settings. By completing carefully selected general education courses, students will be able transfer those units to 4-year colleges in order to continue their education toward an advanced degree and potential licensure in Social Work, Counseling or related fields.

Objectives

- 1. Graduates will have the opportunity to complete appropriate lower-division general education courses that will transfer to four-year college or university degree programs in Social Work, Counseling or related majors.
- 2. Students will have a basic understanding of the history and role of Social Work and related occupations in their communities and society at large.
- 3. Students will understand the importance of ethical behavior, and of technical and cultural competence in the delivery of services in Social Work and related fields.
- 4. Students will demonstrate a basic understanding of the characteristics and key concepts related to Social Work and related occupations.
- 5. Students will demonstrate an understanding of basic duties and responsibilities performed by Social Workers and related professionals.
- 6. Human Services Paraprofessional Associate of Science Degree instructors, staff, and other key college personnel will maintain a regular, constructive and collegial dialogue with partnering human service agencies in order to optimize student educational experiences
