MENDOCINO-LAKE COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT MEASURE W FACILITY BOND FUNDS

On November 7, 2006, voters in the Mendocino-Lake Community College District (MLCCD) passed Measure W, authorizing \$67.5 million in facility bond funds. Measure W encompasses 30 construction and renovation projects that include the Ukiah campus, Lake County Center and the Willits Center. The first Bond Issuance, in the amount of \$30 million, took place in March 2007.




