RESPONSIBILITITES

Under direction of the Executive Dean of Nursing, assists the Dean in content and curriculum development and review in the psychology subfield of nursing.

- Attend monthly all faculty meetings (in person or via web/zoom meetings)
- Participate in online or telephone consultation with faculty regarding clinical or theoretical applications of psychology content based on evidence based clinical practice.
- Review psychiatric nursing theory content in curriculum and program development consistent with BRN guidelines and evidence based practice.
- Review syllabi for psychiatric nursing content curriculum and classes consistent with BRN guidelines and NCLEX relevancy.
- Review psychiatric nursing test items for NCLEX relevancy.
- Assist with coordination of clinical assignments in the psychiatric nursing clinical areas
- Act as the assigned content expert in psychiatric nursing for purpose of BRN.

QUALIFICATIONS

Meet the qualifications of BRN Psychiatric Content Expert as defined by the BRN in Section CCR Section 1424F:

- A master's degree in psychiatric area of nursing, or:
- Master's degree in another area of nursing and:
- A minimum of 240 hours of clinical experience within the previous 3 years in the psychiatric area of nursing
- Completed at least 30 hours of continuing education or 2 semester units related to psychiatric nursing or
- Worked an academic year as a registered nurse teaching clinical psychiatric nursing within the past five years
- Hold a current and active California RN license



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<u>Ability to</u>: Communicate effectively with various faculty and administrators on subject content requirements and insights into programmatic compliance and opportunities. Comply with the regulations put forth by the BRN and District policies and procedures. Support the Nursing Department with ongoing review and insights in Psychiatric Nursing content curriculum and programs.

SALARY AND BENEFITS:

This is a temporary assignment based on specific skills and abilities applied to a specific project. Approximately 30 hours per semester, \$100 per hour, January-May (16 weeks). Ed Code 88003 authorizes a governing board to hire professional expert employees for less than 75% of a school year, up to 180 days.
