Mendocino College PTA Program

Mendocino College is excited to announce the development of a new PTA program at our campus in Ukiah, CA. The PTA program is a two-year program with students earning an Associates of Science degree and eligibility to take the National Physical Therapy Exam for licensure as a PTA upon completion.

Innovative Program Model

Mendocino College and Shasta College are working collaboratively to develop physical therapist assistant programs at their respective colleges. These programs have a hybrid nature with only two on-campus days each week for lab coursework. This model will benefit our rural populations by allowing the majority of coursework to be completed through online courses on Canvas.

The hybrid model will allow greater access to career education to students in the outlying rural areas who would otherwise have to travel a significant distance. It will offer greater flexibility to students who have other commitments in life, such as work and family, helping meet the need of our diverse population in our respective areas. Faculty at both colleges have been working together on program and curriculum development. The programs will be virtually identical and allow for the possibility of shared adjunct faculty to teach online coursework.
