CSU Minimum Eligibility Requirements for Upper Division Transfer Students

Who is a CSU Upper-Division Transfer Student?

If you will have at least 60 semester units by the time you enter a CSU, you are considered an upper-division transfer applicant.

To be admitted to the California State University as an upper-division transfer (UDT) student, you must:

- Complete a minimum of 60 semester units of transferable coursework;
- Have an overall college GPA of at least 2.00; your GPA is calculated using all your transfer units attempted. In high-demand majors and campuses a GPA of 2.00 may not be sufficient to be admitted;
- Complete 10 general education (30 semester units) transfer courses, with a grade of Cor better, including four courses completed in the following areas (in either column):
